JOHN 10:11-18

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

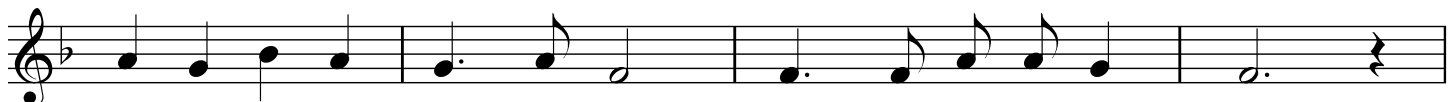

THE INVITATION

If you feel called to this table of mercy and grace, know there is a place set for you. There are two different stations that function two distinct ways.

At the Thanksgiving or Side Altar, This is a Gluten Free station with intinction only. At this station you may intinct (or dip) the bread into the holy wine yourself. If you only want to receive the bread, please cross your arms after consuming.

At the altar rails, you will receive the holy bread in your hands. You may choose to sip from the chalice or to intinct (or dip) the holy bread into the holy wine yourself. If you only want to receive the bread, please cross your arms after consuming.

The response after receiving the bread only, or the bread and wine, is "Amen." Those not communing may come forward for a blessing, keeping your hands folded across your chest.
